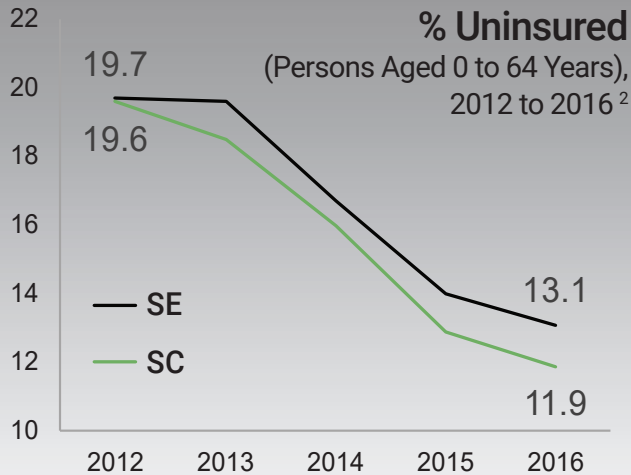

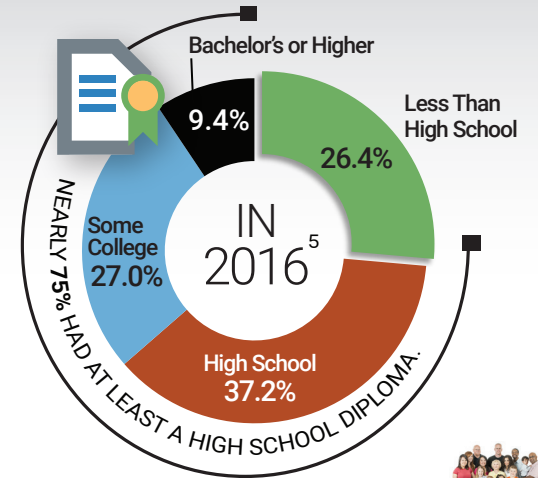

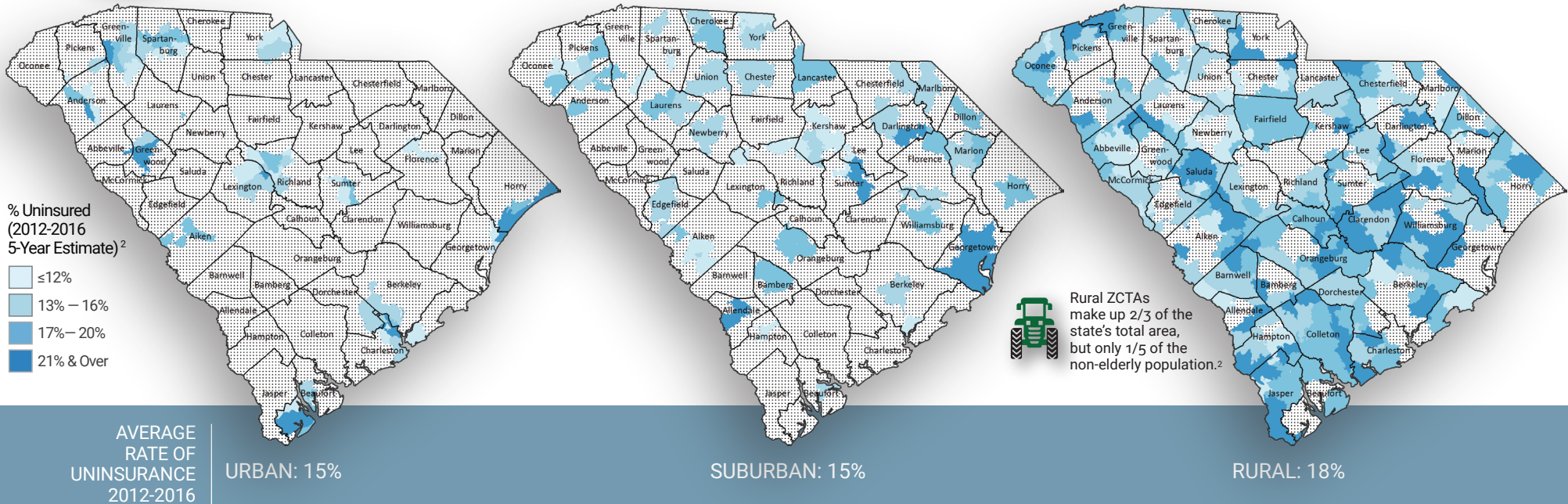

# In South Carolina, place matters.

In 2016, uninsurance rates varied substantially both from one county to another and within single counties. Much of South Carolina is categorized as “rural” and those rural areas had some of the state’s highest uninsurance rates.<sup>3</sup>



## % of South Carolinians Uninsured in 2016<sup>4</sup>

by Age, Race/Ethnicity, & Income

Only 4% of SC children were uninsured.



10% of SC's Non-Hispanic Whites were uninsured.



12% of Black South Carolinians were uninsured.

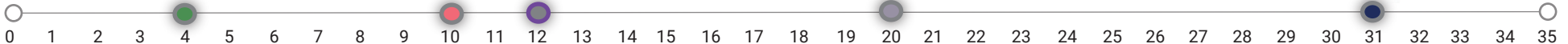


One in every five low-income (<138% FPL)<sup>5</sup> South Carolinians was uninsured.

Close to a third of Hispanic South Carolinians lacked health insurance.

2. Map depicts uninsurance rates at the ZIP Code Tabulation Area (ZCTA) level. Source: ACS 2012-2016 5-Year Estimates. Uninsurance rates for ZCTAs with 50 or fewer civilian, non-elderly, non-institutionalized residents are not mapped.
3. Classifications are based on the percentage of a ZCTA's total population defined as “urban” by the Census Bureau (Census 2010): Urban (>72.5%); Suburban (43.0% to 72.5%); Rural (<43.0%).
4. “Children” are ages 0-17. All other populations noted are ages 0-64.
